



*The large white **Paschal Candle** is placed on a stand near the baptismal font as a visual reminder that in our baptism, we are crucified and resurrected with Christ. The candle is lighted at each celebration of Baptism, at which time small baptismal candles are lighted from it for presentation to the baptized or sponsor. This act is a reminder of the integral connection between Baptism and Easter. The paschal candle is also lighted on the Sundays of Easter and for funerals. The paschal candle visually proclaims the message of Romans 6:3-5 (used at the beginning of the funeral liturgy): "In our Baptism we have already died and been raised with Christ." Although not a part of church tradition, we are lighting the candle today to centralize our thoughts on the completion of baptism that is celebrated through the remembrance of those who have entered into their eternal reward.*
